Re: Physical Security Improvements

Dear Ms. Moon:

ISSUE: This is in response to your e-mail sent on November 15, 2013, wherein you advise that, due to the occurrence of four (4) armed robberies in the past six (6) months that have been committed within five (5) miles of your business, you would like to add, inside your building, some physical security improvements. Specifically, you would like to install a wall-mount package delivery vault, similar to those used at banks, gas stations, and late night convenience stores. You would also add a locking vestibule made of bullet-proof glass. The vestibule's bullet-proof glass would allow you to ensure proper identification of your customers, while the package delivery vault would allow you and your customers to pass, back and forth, identification, payment, and inventory.

Records of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board ("Board") indicate that Huskies Beer Distributor hold Distributor License No. D-2947 (LID 66867) for the premises located at 6835 Buffalo Road, Harborcreek, Pennsylvania.

OPINION: There is nothing in the Liquor Code or the Board's Regulations that would prohibit you from implementing the physical security improvements that you have described.

Please note, however, that if the improvements change the configuration of the licensed premises in any respect, you would be required to notify the Board's Bureau of Licensing. Also, the vestibule should be part of the premises covered by the license. If it is not currently part of the licensed premises, you would need to submit an Application for Extension of Wholesale License to Cover Additional Premises (Form PLCB-1708). This form is available on the Board's website at www.lcb.state.pa.us.
