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RE: The Ultimate Absolut Cosmopolitan Experience Sweepstakes

Dear Mr. Radbell:

ISSUE: This correspondence is in response to your letter of February 4, 2014, in which you request approval to run a sweepstakes promotion in Pennsylvania.

According to the official rules you provided, the “Ultimate Absolut® Cosmopolitan Experience Sweepstakes” promotion is scheduled to run from February 15 through April 30, 2014. Consumers may participate by submitting an online entry form at the promotional website. On or about May 2, 2014, one (1) entrant will be randomly selected to receive the grand prize of a trip for two (2) to Las Vegas, Nevada, including round-trip airfare, ground transportation, hotel accommodations for two (2) nights, brunch at Bouchon Bistro at the Venetian, dinner at Scarpetta at the Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas, Dinner at Sage at Aria, and a personal shopping experience at Neiman Marcus with spending money of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the winner and five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for his/her guest. The promotion is open only to legal residents of the contiguous United States who are twenty-one (21) years of age or older, and no purchase is necessary to enter.

OPINION: Section 5.32(h) of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board’s (“Board”) Regulations states that a manufacturer or licensee may sponsor sweepstakes promotions subject to the following conditions:

- i. No purchase is necessary to enter.
- ii. Entrants shall be twenty-one (21) years of age or older.

- iii. Retail licensed premises may only be involved as pick-up or drop-off points for entry forms and not for the conducting of drawings or the awarding of prizes.
- iv. Alcoholic beverages may not be part of the prize.

[40 Pa. Code § 5.32(h)].

This office has reviewed the proposed sweepstakes and determined that it comports with applicable liquor laws and regulations, specifically section 493(24)(i) of the Liquor Code and section 5.32(h) of the Board's Regulations [47 P.S. § 4-493(24)(i); 40 Pa. Code § 5.32(h)], assuming alcoholic beverages are not included in the prize.

Therefore, it would be permissible to conduct this promotion in the Commonwealth, as indicated above, in reference to the areas checked below:

- retail licensed premises.
- distributor licensed premises.
- both retail and distributor licensed premises.
- the Board's wine and spirit stores, subject to approval of the Bureau of Product Selection.
- other – Internet, text messaging.

While you do not indicate any intention to utilize point-of-sale ("POS") material to support the sweepstakes, please be advised that prior approval of malt or brewed beverages POS material and retail licensed premises POS material is no longer required. However, the requirement for prior approval of POS material intended for use in the Board's wine and spirits stores from the Bureau of Product Selection remains. The total cost of all POS advertising material relating to any one (1) brand of any one (1) manufacturer at any one (1) time may not exceed three hundred dollars (\$300.00) on a retail licensed premises. [47 P.S. § 4-493(20)(i)].

THIS OPINION APPLIES ONLY TO THE FACTUAL SITUATION DESCRIBED HEREIN AND DOES NOT INSULATE THE LICENSEE OR OTHERS FROM CONSEQUENCES OF CONDUCT OCCURRING PRIOR TO ITS ISSUANCE. THE PROPRIETY OF THE PROPOSED CONDUCT HAS BEEN ADDRESSED ONLY UNDER THE LIQUOR CODE AND

REGULATIONS. THE LAWS AND POLICIES ON WHICH THIS OPINION IS BASED ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY THE LEGISLATURE OR THE PENNSYLVANIA LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD.
