RE: Live in the Vineyard Sweepstakes

Dear Ms. Speelman:

ISSUE: This correspondence is in response to your e-mail of August 21, 2014, in which you request legal review of a sweepstakes promotion being conducted in Pennsylvania by Sutter Home Winery, Inc.

According to the official rules you provided, the “Live in the Vineyard Sweepstakes” promotion is scheduled to run from September 1 through October 20, 2014. Consumers may participate by following the instructions for entry online at the promotional website. Two (2) entrants will be randomly selected to each receive a trip for two (2) to Napa, California, including round-trip airfare, reimbursement for a rental car, hotel accommodations for three (3) nights, admission to various “Live in the Vineyard” events, and a prepaid debit card valued at two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00). No alcoholic beverages will be included in the prizes. The promotion is open only to legal residents of the United States who are twenty-one (21) years of age or older, and no purchase is necessary to enter.

OPINION: Section 5.32(h) of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board’s (“Board”) Regulations states that a manufacturer or licensee may sponsor sweepstakes promotions subject to the following conditions:

- i. No purchase is necessary to enter.
- ii. Entrants shall be twenty-one (21) years of age or older.
- iii. Retail licensed premises may only be involved as pick-up or drop-off points for entry forms and not for the conducting of drawings or the awarding of prizes.
- iv. Alcoholic beverages may not be part of the prize.

[40 Pa. Code § 5.32(h)].

This office has reviewed the proposed sweepstakes and determined that it comports with applicable liquor laws and regulations, specifically section 493(24)(i) of the Liquor Code and section 5.32(h) of the Board's Regulations [47 P.S. § 4-493(24)(i); 40 Pa. Code § 5.32(h)].

Therefore, it would be permissible to conduct this promotion in the Commonwealth in reference to the areas checked below:

- retail licensed premises.
- distributor licensed premises.
- both retail and distributor licensed premises.
- the Board's wine and spirit stores, subject to approval of the Bureau of Product Selection.
- other – Internet, text messaging.

THIS OPINION APPLIES ONLY TO THE FACTUAL SITUATION DESCRIBED HEREIN AND DOES NOT INSULATE THE LICENSEE OR OTHERS FROM CONSEQUENCES OF CONDUCT OCCURRING PRIOR TO ITS ISSUANCE. THE PROPRIETY OF THE PROPOSED CONDUCT HAS BEEN ADDRESSED ONLY UNDER THE LIQUOR CODE AND REGULATIONS. THE LAWS AND POLICIES ON WHICH THIS OPINION IS BASED ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY THE LEGISLATURE OR THE PENNSYLVANIA LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD.
