**RE: Crown Royal Nominate Your Local Hero Contest**

Dear Mr. Schleifstein:

ISSUE: This correspondence is in response to your letter dated September 22, 2014, in which you seek legal review of a proposed contest promotion to be conducted by Diageo Americas, Inc., in Pennsylvania.

According to the official rules you provided, the “Crown Royal Nominate Your Local Hero Contest” promotion is scheduled to run from October 27 through November 30, 2014. Consumers may participate via the promotional website. An independent judging organization will select one (1) entrant to receive the grand prize of a “weekend getaway” package including a one thousand dollar (\$1,000.00) spa voucher and a five hundred dollar (\$500.00) gift card. No purchase is necessary to enter, and the sweepstakes is open only to Pennsylvania residents who are twenty-one (21) years of age or older at the time of entry.

OPINION: Section 5.32(h) of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board’s (“Board”) Regulations states that a manufacturer or licensee may sponsor sweepstakes promotions subject to the following conditions:

- i. No purchase is necessary to enter.
- ii. Entrants shall be twenty-one (21) years of age or older.
- iii. Retail licensed premises may only be involved as pick-up or drop-off points for entry forms and not for the conducting of drawings or the awarding of prizes.
- iv. Alcoholic beverages may not be part of the prize.

[40 Pa. Code § 5.32(h)]

This office has reviewed the proposed promotion and has determined that it comports with applicable liquor laws and regulations, specifically subsection 493(24) of the Liquor Code [47 P.S. § 4-493(24)] and section 5.32(h) of the Board’s Regulations [40 Pa. Code § 5.32(h)].

Therefore, it would be permissible to conduct this promotion in the Commonwealth in reference to the areas checked below:

- retail licensed premises.
- distributor licensed premises.
- both retail and distributor licensed premises.
- the Board's wine and spirits stores, subject to approval of the Bureau of Product Management.
- other – Internet, text messaging.

THIS OPINION APPLIES ONLY TO THE FACTUAL SITUATION DESCRIBED HEREIN AND DOES NOT INSULATE THE LICENSEE OR OTHERS FROM CONSEQUENCES OF CONDUCT OCCURRING PRIOR TO ITS ISSUANCE. THE PROPRIETY OF THE PROPOSED CONDUCT HAS BEEN ADDRESSED ONLY UNDER THE LIQUOR CODE AND REGULATIONS. THE LAWS AND POLICIES ON WHICH THIS OPINION IS BASED ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY THE LEGISLATURE OR THE PENNSYLVANIA LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD.
