RE: Transfer of License

Dear Ms. Desimone:

ISSUE: This is in response to your e-mail of September 7, 2014 in which you ask for information on how to transfer a license from a wife to a husband. It is assumed for, for the purpose of this response that the location of the licensed premises is not changing.

Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board (“Board”) records indicate that Welcome Lake Enterprises Inc., trading as The White Owl Tavern holds Restaurant (“R”) License No. R-14652 (LID 56372), for the premises located at 318 Welcome Lake Road, Beach Lake, Pennsylvania.

OPINION: Since The White Owl Tavern is held by a corporation, you would not need to formally transfer the license to a new entity, but need only to transfer the shares of the corporation. In the situation you described in your e-mail, you would transfer the shares from you to your husband. Once that is completed, you would need to complete and submit PLCB Form- 866 to notify the Board of their change.
