RE: Rib Shack Red & the Beachhouse Wines South African Summer Sweepstakes

Dear Mr. Rauch:

ISSUE: This correspondence is in response to your e-mail of April 2, 2015, in which you request legal review, on behalf of your client, Pacific Highway Wines & Spirits, of a proposed sweepstakes promotion to be conducted in Pennsylvania

According to the official rules you provided, the “Rib Shack Red & the Beachhouse Wines South African Summer Sweepstakes” promotion is scheduled to run from May 1 through 31, 2015. Consumers may participate by submitting an entry online via the promotional website or by mail. Two (2) entrants will be randomly selected to each receive the grand prize of a trip for two (2) to Cape Town, South Africa, including airfare, lodging for six (6) nights, a guided tour of a pair of wineries, a sightseeing tour, a dinner cruise, shuttle transfers, breakfast, a gift bag, and a travel wallet. Alcoholic beverages will not be included. The promotion is open only to Pennsylvania residents of legal drinking age, and no purchase is necessary to enter.

OPINION: Section 5.32(h) of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board’s (“Board”) Regulations states that a manufacturer or licensee may sponsor sweepstakes promotions subject to the following conditions:

- i. No purchase is necessary to enter.
- ii. Entrants shall be twenty-one (21) years of age or older.
- iii. Retail licensed premises may only be involved as pick-up or drop-off points for entry forms and not for the conducting of drawings or the awarding of prizes.
- iv. Alcoholic beverages may not be part of the prize.

[40 Pa. Code § 5.32(h)].

This office has reviewed the promotion and determined that it comports with applicable liquor laws and regulations, specifically section 493(24)(i) of the Liquor Code and section 5.32(h) of the Board's Regulations [47 P.S. § 4-493(24)(i); 40 Pa. Code § 5.32(h)].

Therefore, it would be permissible to conduct this promotion in the Commonwealth in reference to the areas checked below:

- retail licensed premises.
- distributor licensed premises.
- both retail and distributor licensed premises.
- the Board's wine and spirit stores, subject to approval of the Bureau of Product Selection.
- other – Internet, text messaging.

THIS OPINION APPLIES ONLY TO THE FACTUAL SITUATION DESCRIBED HEREIN AND DOES NOT INSULATE THE LICENSEE OR OTHERS FROM CONSEQUENCES OF CONDUCT OCCURRING PRIOR TO ITS ISSUANCE. THE PROPRIETY OF THE PROPOSED CONDUCT HAS BEEN ADDRESSED ONLY UNDER THE LIQUOR CODE AND REGULATIONS. THE LAWS AND POLICIES ON WHICH THIS OPINION IS BASED ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY THE LEGISLATURE OR THE PENNSYLVANIA LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD.
