RE: Transport-for-Hire Vehicle Identification

Dear Mr. Stalter:

ISSUE: This is in response to your e-mail of April 13, 2015, wherein you state that annotated on the bottom of your company's Class A license is the requirement to display it at your place of business, which you have done at your home location in Wisconsin. You are unable to locate any specific language that requires you to display the license on the exterior of each vehicle used for transportation. You have checked sections 467 and 512 of the Liquor Code, and request the location of the specific language requiring display of the permit on each vehicle.

Records of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board ("Board") indicate that H.O. Wolding Inc. holds Transporter-For-Hire Class A License No. IA-4181 (LID 62457) with corporate headquarters located at 9642 Western Way, Amherst, Wisconsin.

OPINION: The Board's Regulations do not require a transporter-for-hire licensee to display its license on the exterior of each vehicle, but rather require a transporter-for-hire to:

display on each side of each vehicle used in the operation of the business their name, address including the street name and number as shown on the license and the license number as shown on the license in letters no smaller than 4 inches in height. The license identification number shall be preceded by the letters "P. L. C. B."

[40 Pa. Code § 9.22].

Note, however, that a subsequent change to the Liquor Code lowered the required height of the lettering on licensee vehicles from four (4) inches to no smaller than two

(2) inches in height. [47 P.S. §§ 4-491(12), 4-492(9)]. This office has historically approved the use of magnetic signs that otherwise meet all requirements of the Liquor Code and Board's Regulations pertaining to vehicle identification. [47 P.S. §§ 4-491(12), 4-492(9)].
