**RE: Federal Firearms License**

Dear Mr. Houghton:

ISSUE: Your correspondence of April 3, 2015 inquires whether you can hold a federal firearms license within your liquor-licensed establishment.

Records of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board (“Board”) indicate that you are the holder of Restaurant Liquor License No. R-5905 (LID 59250) for use at premises located 2608 Portage Street, P.O. Box 162, Wilmore, Pennsylvania.

OPINION: Nothing in the Liquor Code or the Board’s Regulations prohibits a liquor licensee from holding a federal firearms license. However, a licensee may not conduct another business on its licensed premises without Board approval. [40 Pa. Code § 3.52(c)].

THIS OPINION APPLIES ONLY TO THE FACTUAL SITUATION DESCRIBED HEREIN AND DOES NOT INSULATE THE LICENSEE OR OTHERS FROM CONSEQUENCES OF CONDUCT OCCURRING PRIOR TO ITS ISSUANCE. THE PROPRIETY OF THE PROPOSED CONDUCT HAS BEEN ADDRESSED ONLY UNDER THE LIQUOR CODE AND REGULATIONS. THE LAWS AND POLICIES ON WHICH THIS OPINION IS BASED ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY THE LEGISLATURE OR THE PENNSYLVANIA LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD.
