**RE: Home for the Holidays Promotion**

Dear Ms. Speelman:

ISSUE: This correspondence is in response to your e-mail received July 27, 2015, in which you request legal review of a proposed contest promotion to be conducted in Pennsylvania, sponsored by Sutter Home Winery, Inc.

According to the official rules you provided, the “Home for the Holidays” promotion is scheduled to run from August 1 through December 31, 2015. Consumers may participate online via the promotional website, by facsimile, or by mail. The Veterans Business Outreach Center will select award winners to receive round-trip airfare to the winner’s home destination, money for ground transportation, and hotel accommodations. The promotion is open only to U.S. military members, Reservists, and, Guard members who are of legal drinking age and who are residents of the fortyeight (48) contiguous United States. No purchase is necessary to enter.

OPINION: Section 5.32(h) of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board’s (“Board”) Regulations states that a manufacturer or licensee may sponsor sweepstakes promotions subject to the following conditions:

- i. No purchase is necessary to enter.
- ii. Entrants shall be twenty-one (21) years of age or older.
- iii. Retail licensed premises may only be involved as pick-up or dropoff points for entry forms and not for the conducting of drawings or the awarding of prizes.
- iv. Alcoholic beverages may not be part of the prize.

[40 Pa. Code § 5.32(h)].

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This office has reviewed the promotion and determined that it comports with applicable liquor laws and regulations, specifically section 493(24)(i) of the Liquor Code and section 5.32(h) of the Board's Regulations [47 P.S. § 4-493(24)(i); 40 Pa. Code § 5.32(h)].

Therefore, it would be permissible to conduct this promotion in the Commonwealth in reference to the areas checked below:

retail licensed premises.  distributor licensed premises.

both retail and distributor licensed premises.

the Board's wine and spirit stores, subject to approval of the Bureau of Product Selection.  other – Internet, text messaging.

THE LAWS AND POLICIES ON WHICH THIS OPINION IS BASED ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY THE LEGISLATURE OR THE PENNSYLVANIA LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD.
