Re: Shipping Wine Out of State

Dear Ms. Mack:

ISSUE: This is in response to your e-mail dated November 4, 2015, wherein you advise that you are a Pennsylvania-licensed limited winery. You ask if you may ship wine out of state, or if you need to obtain a special license.

Records of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board (“Board”) indicate that Dawg Gone Bees LLC holds Limited Winery License No. LK-444 (LID 70760) for the premises at 832 West Middle Street in Hanover, Pennsylvania.

OPINION: There is nothing in the Liquor Code or the Board’s Regulations that prohibits the shipping of wine to other states. However, you should contact the appropriate authority in the receiving state as to what that state requires of you.
